### Market clearance obtained and sales to begin in November.

Today, Ambu A/S announced that the company's single-use cystoscope – Ambu® aScope™ 4 Cysto – has obtained market clearance for the Japanese market.

*"Japan is the second largest endoscopy market in the world and we are happy to be able to supply Japanese urologists and their patients with a single-use cystoscope," says Juan Jose Gonzalez, CEO of Ambu, "We know that there is great interest in exploring a single-use scope because it eliminates the risk of cross-contamination and the need for reprocessing of scopes – cutting healthcare costs and freeing staff from exposure to chemicals during reprocessing."*

Ambu's single-use cystoscope received market clearance in the USA in April 2020.

#### **First-movers in single-use scope technology**

Ambu developed the world's first single-use flexible endoscope – a bronchoscope – in 2009. Since then the advanced single-use technology has been further developed, and Ambu is now supplying scopes across clinical specialties.

Today, Ambu offers single-use bronchoscopes (airways and lungs), rhinolaryngoscopes (nose and throat), cystoscopes (urinary tract) and a recently FDA-cleared duodenoscope (bile duct and pancreas). Furthermore, Ambu has the richest single-use endoscopy pipeline with 12 new products set for launch by 2022.
